

APPENDIX A TO SC EBOLA PREPARATION AND RESPONSE PLAN

EBOLA RESPONSE TIME LINE

I. INTRODUCTION

A. General.

The following Response Timeline describes the major activities from initial suspicion of an Ebola patient in South Carolina through confirmed Ebola cases exceeding State and immediately available Federal medical resources within SC.

The SERT is expected to complete procedures outlined in their respective ESF SOP, the SCEOP and the South Carolina Ebola Preparation and Response Plan.

B. Purpose.

The Timeline assumes limited or no notice Ebola patient presentation to a medical facility, health care provider or EMS entity within the State of South Carolina.

C. Scope.

Actions will be addressed from no suspected Ebola Cases within SC, through confirmed cases that exceed identified capability of resources available within the state. Continuous, ongoing actions show only for the initial occurrence but continue as required.

Items in **BOLD** are time decisions required to enable complete/timely execution of actions identified in consequent stages.
